Program Content

Techniques & practical skills that students learn include:

- A range of technical and customer service skills to provide a range of beauty services including nail, waxing, lash and brow and basic make-up services
- Performing manicures and pedicures including decorative nail art, nail repair and other hand and foot treatments
- Treating unwanted hair
- Evaluating beauty therapy processes and products
- Managing appointment bookings and client records
- How to apply cosmetics and make-up correctly
- Analysing client needs, skin characteristics and providing advice on suitable skin care

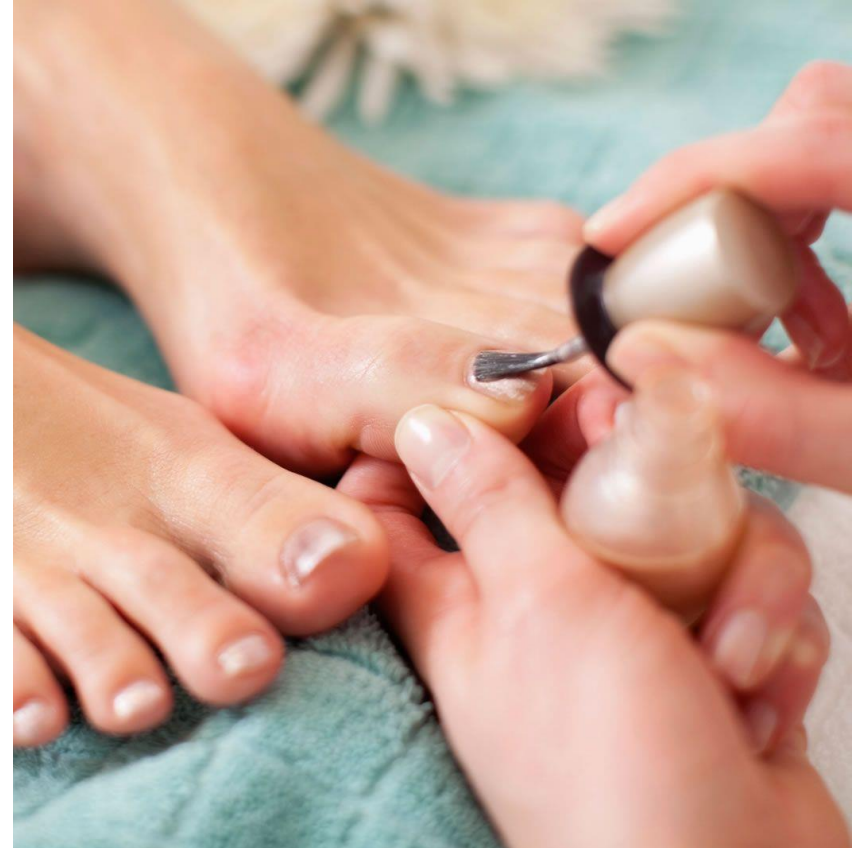


Structured Workplace Learning

Recommended

Structured workplace learning complements the training undertaken during class time. It provides the context for:

- Enhanced skill development
- Practical application of industry knowledge
- Assessment of units of competency/modules as determined by the RTO
- Increased employment opportunities.





Contribution to VCE & VCAL

VCE

Students will receive two VCE VET units at 1 – 2 level, and one VCE VET 3 – 4 sequence.

Students completing an unscored VCE VET program who receive a Units 3 and 4 sequence will be eligible for an increment towards their ATAR.

This will be calculated using 10% of the lowest study score of the primary four.

VCAL

Contribution to VCAL is determined by the number of units of competence successfully completed.

When a student has been assessed as competent in units totalling 90 nominal hours, this will contribute one VCAL unit towards satisfactory completion of VCAL.

Students can receive up to 4 VCAL credits for VET Beauty Services.

This program will satisfy learning outcomes for the Industry Specific Skills and Work Related Skills strands of VCAL.

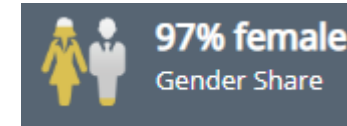
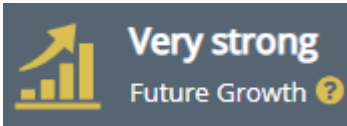

Job Outlook in Australia



PROFILE: In Sunraysia there are many employment options in this industry. Local employers include Beauty Salons, Hairdressing Salons, and self-employment. There are also many opportunities for beauty therapists at resorts, on cruise ships, providing services in aged care facilities and in hospitals, as well as in the television, film and theatre industry or fashion industry.

OUTLOOK: The number of people working as Beauty Therapists (in their main job) grew very strongly over the past 5 years and is expected to grow very strongly over the next 5 years: from 36,100 in 2018 to 42,800 by 2023.

SKILLS & TRAINING: You usually need a certificate III or IV in beauty services or beauty therapy to work as a Beauty Therapist. These courses may be offered as a traineeship.

More generally, employers look for workers who are **RELIABLE**, **well presented**, and who can **interact well with others**.
