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Program Details

This qualification enables you to provide supervised assistance to allied health professionals, without conducting programs or therapeutic interventions.

You will learn the skills, which will allow you to support patient therapy in a specialised area as well as all the safety, communication, and personal skills to make sure you are confident and competent in a demanding workplace.

This program is delivered one day per week at SuniTAFE.

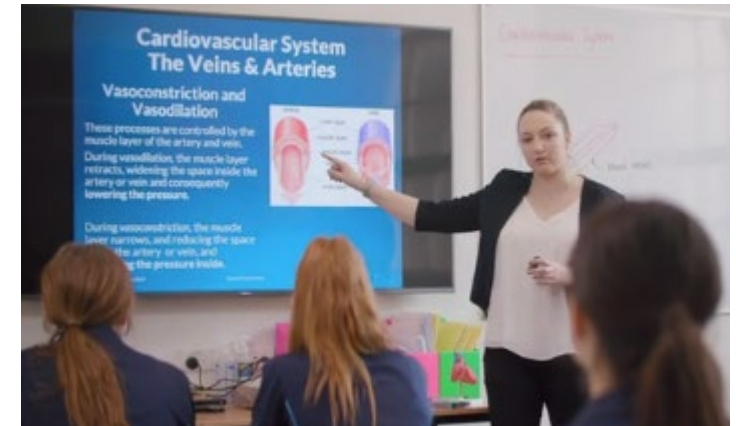

Program Content

Techniques & practical skills that students learn include:

- Following treatment plans for therapeutic interventions
- Conducting programs under direct or indirect supervision
- Assisting clients with movement
- Applying infection control measures including wearing personal protective equipment and performing hand hygiene
- Undertaking administrative duties such as making client appointments
- Using assistive devices and clinical equipment
- Using digital technology and ICT skills
- Taking clinical measurements





Structured Workplace Learning

Required

Structured workplace learning (SWL) complements the training undertaken during class time. It provides the context for:

- Enhanced skill development
- Practical application of industry knowledge
- Assessment of units of competency/modules as determined by the RTO
- Increased employment opportunities.

PLEASE NOTE: Students must complete 80 hours of SWL over the two years





Contribution to VCE & VCAL

VCE

Students will receive up to one VCE VET units at 1 – 2 level, and a minimum of three units at the Unit 3 – 4 level.

Students wishing to receive an ATAR contribution for the Units 3 and 4 sequence of a VCE VET program must undertake scored assessment for the purpose of achieving a study score.

This study score can contribute directly to the ATAR, either as one of the student's best four studies (primary four) or as a fifth or sixth study. Where a student elects not to receive a study score, no contribution to the ATAR will be available.

VCAL

Contribution to VCAL is determined by the number of units of competence successfully completed. When a student has been assessed as competent in units totalling 90 nominal hours, this will contribute one VCAL unit towards satisfactory completion of VCAL. Students can receive up to 5 VCAL credits for VET Community Services.

This program will satisfy learning outcomes for the Industry Specific Skills and Work Related Skills strands of VCAL.

Job Outlook in Australia



PROFILE: Healthcare and social assistance represents the largest workforce in the Region by industry (14%). The sector includes a variety of small and large organisations across the Region.

OUTLOOK: Transition to the NDIS and reforms in ageing will increase demand for aged care, disability support and mental health services across the Region. The Region's ageing population and higher rates of obesity, chronic disease, disability and high-risk behaviours (e.g. smoking) relative to the Victorian population average will increase demand for services more broadly. Providers are also looking to increase service offerings for complex healthcare needs to reduce out-of-region transfers.

SKILLS & TRAINING: VET will play a critical role in training the required future supply of aged-care workers, disability support workers and personal care workers through the Certificate III in Individual Support. Enrolled nurses, allied health assistants and other health service assistants will pursue the Diploma of Nursing, Certificate III in Allied Health Assistance and Certificate III in Health Service Assistance respectively.

More generally, employers look for workers who are **CARING, compassionate, empathic**, have **GOOD PEOPLE SKILLS** and who can **work well in a team**.



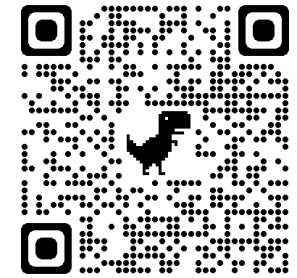
